


#### WELCOME

This has certainly been the case with Go!, and we are so excited to be able to share the result with you this evening.





Meet some of the Egyptian gods who feature in the musical:



Ra (also known as Atum Ra) - god of the sun



Horus/Harmachis – god of many things including kingship and the sky



Ptah – god of creation

And here are a few more:

Horakhty - combination of Horus + Ra

Apis – bull god

Mnevis – another bull god

Huh/Heh/Hah – god of infinity and eternity

Heka – god of medicine and magic

Hapi – god of the flooding of the Nile

#### **EGYPTOLOGY: ASTROLOGERS**

The Ancient Egyptian astrologers in our musical tell us that their astrologic practices are technically rather complex, but they mostly link their zodiac signs to the characters of certain gods. They invite you to check your Egyptian horoscope here:

## 1. Nile: January 1-7, June 19-28, September 1-7, November 18-26

The Nile was the lifeblood of Ancient Egypt. You are logical, peaceful, and practical. You avoid arguments and try to keep the peace. You're wise but you sometimes get carried by your passions. You have developed strong intuition by carefully observing others.

- 2. Amun-Ra: January 8–21, February 1–11 Lucky you! Amun-Ra is the king of the gods. You are confident, polite, and optimistic. You are an effective leader and a smart decision-maker.
- 3. Mut January 22–31, September 8–22
  Mut is the world's mum, responsible for protecting everyone. You are affectionate, sensitive, generous and loyal. Not only that but you're also focused and ambitious. You are very protective of people you care about.
- 4. Geb: February 12–29, August 20–31 Geb is god of the earth, whose laughter started earthquakes. As a Geb person, you are open, loyal and sensitive. You may be a bit over-emotional on occasion, but others find this engaging. You're a bit shy but you're a reliable friend and can be very persistent if you need to.

# 5. Osiris: March 1–10, November 27 – December 18

Osiris is god of the underworld and resurrection. You are intelligent and independent, with the potential to become a strong leader. Few obstacles can stop you achieving your goals, but you can be aggressive and selfish, even vulnerable at times. You always say what you mean.

# 6. Isis: March 11-31, October 18-29, December 19-31

Isis is the goddess of nature. You are straight and honest. Romantic and sociable, you've a great sense of humour and are a good team player.

#### 7. Thoth: April 1-19, November 8-17

Thoth is the god of learning and wisdom. You are wise, brave and energetic, constantly striving to improve yourself. You enjoy learning and are very innovative.

- 8. Horus: April 20 May 7, August 12–19
  Horus is god of the sky. You are positive, ambitious and courageous. A wise and pragmatic leader, you inspire and motivate others. You are personable and hardworking.
- 9. Anubis: May 8-27, June 29 July 13
  Anubis is guardian of the underworld and the god of mummification. You're confident and curious, creative and diligent, but you're introverted and prefer working on your own.

# 10. Seth: May 28 – June 18, September 28 – October 2

Seth is the god of chaos and violence. You are brave but a perfectionist. You enjoy challenges and are a great communicator. You love being the centre attention.

## 11. Bastet: July 14-28, September 23-27, October 3-17

Bastet is the goddess of pleasure, fertility and... cats. You crave balance and hate conflict. You're sensitive, affectionate and charming, and a loyal and committed partner. Your intuition rarely lets you down.

# 12. Sekhmet: July 29 – August 11, October 30 – November 7

Sekhmet is the goddess of war. You're a split personality, disciplined on the one side but easy-going on the other. You are a real perfectionist with a strong sense of justice.

#### HISTORY OF UPSTAIRS AT THE GATEHOUSE

As well as being home to London's highest theatre (at 446ft above sea level), The Gatehouse pub has a long and interesting history of its own. Probably the oldest of the inns in Highgate, its 19th century owners claimed that there had been a licensed building on the site since 1337. The building has been a meeting house and courtroom. Lord Byron and Charles Dickens all made use of its services. At the turn of the century, the Gatehouse was famous all over London for its shilling ordinaries — gigantic lunches which filled many a Victorian stomach. In 1905, the building was renovated in the mock Tudor style that remains today. In the 60s, a jazz and folk club featured, on one famous occasion, Paul Simon.

In 2023, Annlouise Butt — the former theatre manager — and Isaac Bernier-Doyle took over as Artistic Directors and have set the theatre on an exciting course. Their plans are to become a regular home for established fringe companies, whilst also focusing heavily on supporting early-career artists, innovative revivals, and new writing/musicals.
